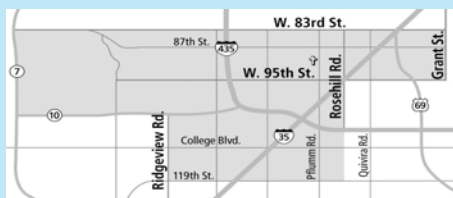

LITURGICAL FORMATION

The Four Dangers of Weak Liturgy

When the liturgy is weak, several dangers pop up.



1. *Individualism.* Liturgy that does not require my active participation allows me to retreat into my individual world and private imagination about who God is. Since no one challenges the God I've dreamed up, I'm free to continue to create God in my own image.
2. *Pietism.* This is a different result of the same problem. We all desire to achieve some kind of intimate connection with Jesus Christ and this is a good thing. Also, there is nothing wrong with private meditation and focusing on our relationship with Christ. In fact, it is essential to a healthy spirituality that we do just that. Just not at Mass. And especially not at Communion. We are in communion not only with Christ in the consecrated bread and wine, but also Christ in the gathered assembly, the Body of Christ, the Church, the people of God.
3. *Apathy.* A regular experience of weak liturgy can lead me to wonder what the point of it all is. I get up, I go to church, I come home, and life goes no just eh same as always. If liturgy is something to watch, there is no need for me to get there until it starts. If the show is boring, there is no reason to stay through the end; so people come late and leave early.
4. *Oppression.* If Christ came to free the oppressed, and the fullness of Christ is manifest in the liturgy, It



follows that a weakened expression of that manifestation will not be as effective in furthering Christ's mission. In other words, the poor of the world, the people of Christ came to serve, are waiting for me to do something. If liturgy isn't teaching me what to do (and motivating me to do it), those poor people are just going to have to wait a little longer.

DRY BONES SOCIETY

The dry bones society is composed of multiple chapters, each consisting of anywhere from 6-10 students and two volunteer chapter leaders. Chapters meet at various times and locations, but involve a weekly commitment to gather and share about all that happens when life and faith collide.

Kings and Queens

We commit some of our greatest offenses against the people we love the most. Spouse, children, parents, siblings—all the people we love have to put up with us. When we are angry, we often take it out on them. When we are tired, we turn away from them. When we are lonely, we overlook them. We know they will love us, so we can sin in their presence, expecting forgiveness.

The one we love most is God. All our sin offends God. But God loves us and offers forgiveness.

Most of our sins are fairly small. They still hurt people. Once in a while, though, we sin gravely. We make a very bad judgment. We hurt someone irretrievably. We betray the values we believe in.

We are not alone. King David did the same thing. He sinned in a terrible way. He lusted after Bathsheba, the wife of Uriah, one of his warriors. David slept with Bathsheba, and she became pregnant. So he placed Bathsheba's husband on the front lines of battle, where the Ammonites killed him.

Nathan the prophet reminded David of all God had done for him. God made him king of Israel, rescued him from his enemies, and increased his house. David responded with sin.

Sometimes when people are good to us, we start to think we are king or queen of all. But we are still subjects of God, who—in mercy—will forgive.

11th Sunday in Ordinary Time C 2 — Galatians 2:16, 19-21

Glamour and Cross

If you want to become like someone else, you talk as they do, go where they go, read what interests them, and pay attention to their friends. If it is some celebrity, you might hang a poster on the wall, visit their web site, and read about them in magazines. You will wear clothing that sports the logos of your favorite teams, perfume that makes you smell like someone else. We often want a piece of the glamour of whatever made someone else popular.

St. Paul wanted the cross. In order to become more like the one he admired, Paul wrote, "I have been crucified with Christ." He chose to become like Jesus in thought, word, and deed. He wanted to be indistinguishable from Jesus. "I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me."

But being like Christ does not mean living with the glamour. It means suffering at the hands of those who disagree. It means taking unpopular opinions. But it also means having the satisfaction of union with one whose life and death have meant everything to the world.

Paul had lived his life in accordance with the old law, but now he had a new law to follow—the law of the Spirit. He learned that law through unity with Christ.

When we become like Christ we will participate in the pain of the cross, but we will also share the serenity of the Spirit.
