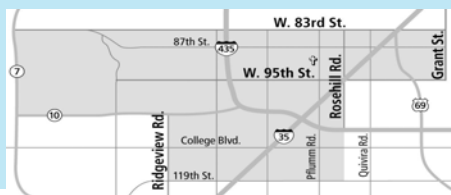

## LITURGICAL FORMATION

### Liturgy: A Self-Assessment



In the liturgy, the aim to be considered before all else is the full, conscious, and active participation of the assembly. How well is our parish community doing at implementing that prime directive from the Second Vatican Council (*Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*)? To accomplish this full participation we have to celebrate liturgy that makes us tremble. Our hearts have to burn within us. Our hearts have to burn with the passion of Christ for the poor (in all its forms), burn with the courage to break the boundaries of oppression, burn with the love of God for all creation.

Let's, over the next few weeks, take an honest assessment of ourselves, and our own full, conscious, and active participation in the liturgy and how we do as a community.

Grade our community as a 1, 2, or 3 on each statement: 1 = seldom true, 2 = sometimes true, 3 = often true

\_\_\_ 1. *Everyone sings the opening song.* The opening song is a key element in the full participation of the assembly. Most people will sing most of the time if the right song is chosen. And if the assembly sings well at the beginning of the liturgy, they are much more likely to participate fully in the rest of the liturgy.

\_\_\_ 2. *Everyone is fully engaged in the readings and the homily.* The lectionary was revised after the Second Vatican Council in order that "the treasures of the Bible...be opened up more lavishly, so that a richer share in God's word may be provided for the faithful" (*Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 51*). But simply reading from the lectionary on Sunday is not sufficient to engender full participation. Besides needing fully trained and well rehearsed lectors and a skilled homilist who can break open the readings in a meaningful way, the members of the community must come prepared to hear the readings.

# LITURGY

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time C 1 — *Zechariah 12:10-11; 13:1*

## ***Suffering with Purpose***

You can put up with suffering if it has some purpose. If sacrifice gives you gratification later on, you can take it. If doing without helps someone you love have a little more, you can do it. If your pain now will lighten the pain of someone else later, you can handle it.

Suffering without purpose is harder to sustain. When the suffering produces no earthly good, it is hard to understand. When someone inflicts suffering on us out of vengeance or hatred, it is hard to forgive. Some suffering is more difficult than other suffering.

Zechariah promised the people that God would pour out a spirit of grace and that the inhabitants of Jerusalem would have a fountain to purify them from sin. But all this would come at a price—the price of suffering.

Namely, people would look on someone who was pierced. They would mourn for him as over an only child, as over a firstborn who was lost. Before the community experienced blessing, they would experience the suffering of loss.

The gospels see in this passage a prophecy about Christ, pierced on the cross with the soldier's lance, mourned as the firstborn, only-begotten son of God.

The loss of Jesus on the cross is a suffering that would have been hard to sustain—if it had no purpose. But it has lightened the loss of nations.

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time C 2 — *Galatians 3:26-29*

## ***Equal Rights***

Equality means you accept others as your equal, and you claim for yourself a position equal to others. Both are essential.

In the eyes of God, all human beings share dignity. Females are equals to males. Turks are equals to Americans. Blacks are equals to whites. The poor are equals to the rich. No matter which group we belong to, we share dignity with every other one.

God looks lovingly upon you and upon the neighbor who gets on your nerves. God appreciates the work you do, as well as the work of your rivals. God likes your school, as well as the one in the next town. If God can love all of us, it should not be too hard for us to love one another.

It also should not be too hard for people to love us. Some of us go under-appreciated for the work we do, the love we share, and the people we are. It is hard to convince others that we are equals. It goes easier if we have first convinced ourselves.

St. Paul told the Gentile Christian converts in Galatia that they were not second-class citizens to Jewish converts. They were equals. "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free person, there is not male and female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus. And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's descendant, heirs according to the promise."
