LITURGICAL FORMATION

Liturgy: A Self-Assessment



Last week we started to take an honest assessment of ourselves, and our own full, conscious, and active participation in the liturgy and how we do as a community. We continue this week

Grade our community as a 1, 2, or 3 on each statement: 1 = seldom true, 2 = sometimes true, 3 = often true

___ 3. *The prayer of the faithful deeply reflects the needs of the community.* The prayer of the faithful (also called the general intercessions) is a central moment in the liturgy. It is the moment when, having been called and formed as a priestly people by the word of God we exercise our priestly role by lifting our communal prayer to God's ear.

___ 4. *The community understands and is engaged in the praying of the Eucharistic Prayer.* The Eucharistic Prayer is supposed to be one of the climactic moments in the liturgy. It has certainly become one of our most passive moments as an assembly during the Mass. Rather than being engaged with the priest, though silently, during this prayer as the Holy Spirit is called down upon the bread and wine that are changed into the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ, our minds, our bodies, often, are somewhere else. Some of this may be due to the texts themselves, which in some cases lack literary style (this will change with the new translations).

Owning Christ

Most people save stuff. We are packrats. We save clothes that have not fit for years. We save computer files we may never look at again. When we run out of closets at home, we rent additional space to store things.

Once in a while we have a garage sale to thin down our possessions. But we rarely hear of anyone getting rid of everything in order to start over again.

When Elisha agreed to follow Elijah as his attendant, he left his livelihood as a farmer. He broke up the yoke he steered for plowing and used it to fuel a fire. He slaughtered his oxen and used the fire to boil their flesh. He served the flesh to his people to eat. Elisha left nothing behind.

To be a follower of Christ, we must be prepared to travel light. Our possessions may distract us from keeping Christ as the center of our being. We may also be distracted by too many interests, too many commitments, too much food, or too much play. When Elisha decided to follow Elijah, he broke up, burned up, and cooked up everything he owned. When we decide to follow Christ, we will leave some things behind.

It will not feel right at first. It is hard to let go of the things of our past. We are packrats. But the future is glorious if Christ is all we own.

Biting and Devouring

We are hard on our elected officials. They do not do enough about unemployment. They have not improved the safety of our streets. They have not done enough for education. Gas prices are too high. It is easy to put the blame on someone who holds an office. But we often forget one thing. We put them there.

Throughout a campaign season, candidates appeal for our vote. Their approach is not always complimentary. They sling mud because they know we appreciate a candidate who is tough. They promise us more money in our pockets because they know we do not want to lose any to people who do not deserve it. In the worst cases, if they are caught lying, stealing, and taking advantage of a position of authority, they are guilty of a crime to which we all contributed: the crime of greed, selfishness, and materialism that has stained the character of our society.

All too often we live by the flesh, not by the Spirit. St. Paul would shake his head. "Live by the Spirit," he says. "The flesh has desires against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh." Too many of us bite and devour one another. For Paul, the Christian law is not summed up in this: "Whoever dies with the most toys wins." But in this: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

We will have a better quality of government, when we share better values among ourselves.
